Board of Education Meeting Highlights  
October 28, 2013

- Chairman Barry Overman called the meeting to order.
- Superintendent Linwood Williams led the Pledge of Allegiance and Moment of Silence.
- Mr. Overman recognized the guests in attendance.
- The minutes of the September 23 meeting were approved.
- Superintendent Williams asked the board to support allowing H.L. Trigg Community School to move forward with scheduling open sessions for parents to discuss the possibility of uniforms or standardized dress code at the school.
- Superintendent Williams presented the Good News Report for October.
- Renee Harris, Director of Accountability & Federal Programs, asked the board members to consider times they could meet with her in small groups to discuss results of EOG and EOC assessments from spring 2013 prior to their anticipated release on November 7.
- Superintendent Williams recognized the 2014 District Principal of the Year, LeVar Mizelle (River Road Middle School). The Board congratulated Mr. Mizelle and presented him with a plaque.
- The Board approved 2013-14 student transfer request recommendations as presented by the Superintendent.

- The Academic Affairs Committee recommended approval of the 2013-14 H.L. Trigg Alternative School Local Options (approved).
- The Policy Committee recommended placing Policy DFC-Grants from Private Sources on customary 4-week review. The Policy Committee also presented Policy Exhibit IIAD-E5 Student E-mail Permission Form.
